Issues of religion and belief frequently top the news agenda and RP helps make sense of them.

RP allows young people growing up in a diverse society to understand the views and opinions of people whose beliefs and values differ from their own.

RP provides space for young people to reflect on their own ideas and develop their thoughts about questions of meaning and ethics.

By having access to good RP in schools, young people are equipped to handle issues in their lives, preparing them for the workplace and adult life.


Paper/Component 1: The study of religious beliefs, teachings and practices

What is assessed?

Beliefs, teachings and practices from Christianity and Islam.

How is it assessed? Written exam: 1 hour 45 minutes 96 marks (plus 3 marks for SPaG) 50% of GCSE

What type of question? Each religion has a common structure of two finance stions of 1, 2, 4, 5, 12 marks. Each religion is marked out of 48.





The GCSE is split into two exams which will both be taken at the end of year 11.

Paper/ Component 2: Thematic studies

What is assessed?

Four religious, philosophical and ethical studies:

- Religion, human rights and social justice
- Religion and human relationships
- Religion, peace and conflict
- Religion, crime and punishment.

How is it assessed?

Written exam: 1 hour 45 minutes 96 marks (plus 3 for SPaG) 50% of GCSE

What type of question? **Each theme** has a common structure of **one five-part question** of 1, 2, 4, 5, 12 marks. Each theme is marked out of 24.

<u>SPaG</u>

Up to 3 marks are given for correct spelling, punctuation and grammar (SPaG) in your 12 mark answers.

3 marks are given for the following:

- You spell and punctuate with consistent accuracy
- You use rules of grammar with effective control of meaning overall
- You use a wide range of specialist terms as appropriate


