Dear Parents/Carers,

The LA have recently launched details of a 'School Streets' consultation for King's School and our neighbouring school West Blatchington Primary School. Full details are attached to this email.

The consultation opens for responses next Monday 8th June and closes on 21st July. I would strongly encourage you to submit your views. The view of the senior team here, including myself, is that this would be a very positive scheme to help ensure the safety of our students. We have had long standing concerns about students' safety on Hangleton Way, given the high volume of traffic on the road at school drop off and pick up times, and parked vehicles on the road. The implementation of this scheme would mean significantly safer streets for students on their journeys to and from school.

Importantly, buses would still be able to access streets meaning no inconvenience for students, and an exemption scheme would operate for parents/carers who need vehicular access permanently (due to disability) or temporarily (due to a broken limb for example).

Thank you in advance for taking the time to submit your views on the scheme.

School Streets scheme

We're proposing to install a new School Streets scheme at **King's School** and **West Blatchington Primary** to reduce congestion and illegal or unsafe parking outside the school during drop off and pick up times.

Brighton & Hove currently has a city-wide programme of School Streets schemes in operation making journeys to and from school safer and more pleasant for everyone.

School Street schemes also encourage more people to walk, wheel, cycle or scoot.

This would mean restricting access to a portion of Hangleton Way and Hardwick Road, Monday to Friday, 8.00am to 9.00am and 2.30pm to 3.30pm during term time.

We will put up signs at the entrances to the School Streets with cameras being used to enforce the restrictions.

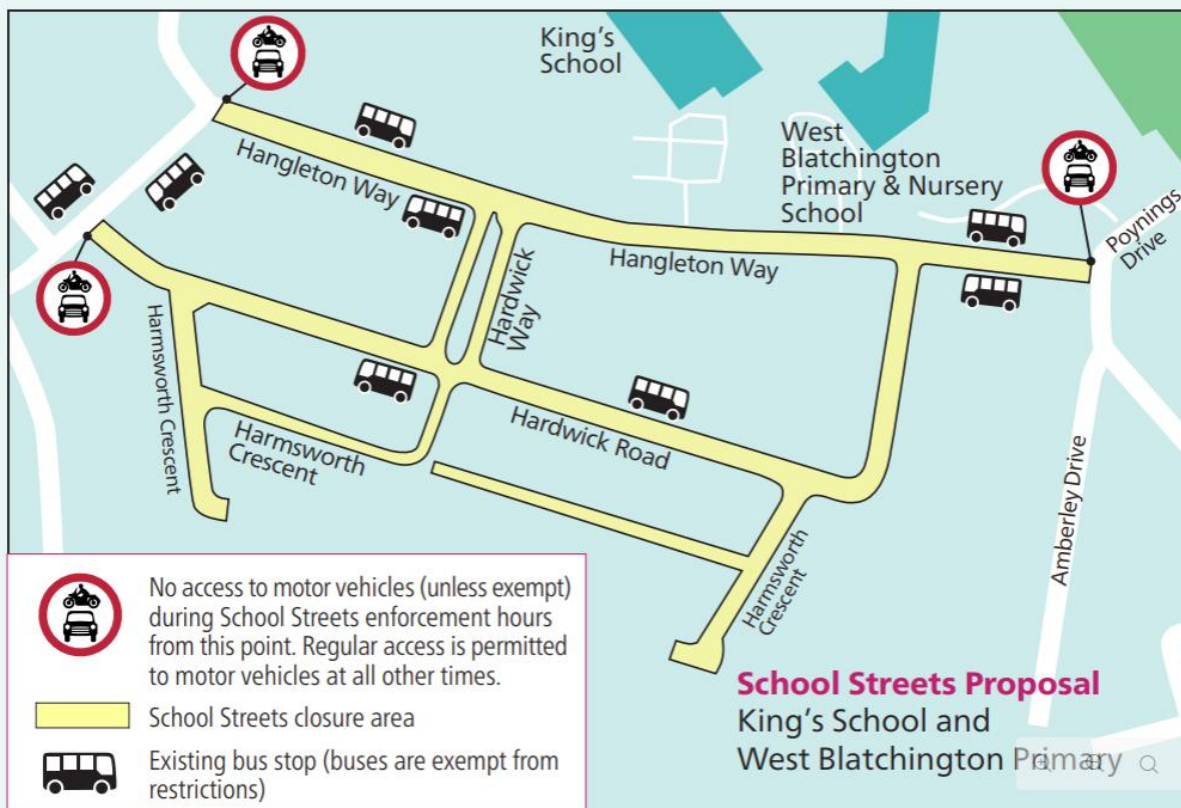

The following changes are being proposed:

- Parts of of Hangleton Way, Hardwick Road and Harmsworth Crescent (as shown) will be closed to motorised traffic between the hours of: 8.00am - 9.00am and 2.30pm - 3.30pm
- Some vehicles will still be allowed access eg, residents of street, blue badge and medical and carer visitors, etc.
- Buses are exempt and will still operate through the closure.



Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)

What is a School Street?

School Streets are time-limited restrictions that reduce vehicle access on certain roads outside schools during drop-off and pick-up times. More information can be found at brighton-hove.gov.uk/school-streets

How enforcement would work

Cameras would be used to monitor the road during the restricted times. Any non-exempt vehicles ignoring the restrictions may be issued with a fine (also known as a Penalty Charge Notice).

The charge for receiving a fine will be £70, reduced to £35 if paid in 21 days. For the first six months, first time offenders would receive a warning notice. A fine would be issued for subsequent offences.

How can I apply for an exemption?

Applications for an exemption can be made on the Brighton & Hove City Council website.

Owners of exempt vehicles would need to register free of charge. More details about the exemption registration process will be provided to the school, parents and carers and local residents closer to the implementation date.

Can deliveries still be made on School Streets

Delivery vehicles are not exempt from restrictions and deliveries can be planned outside of the short restriction periods. Alternatively, delivery drivers can park outside of the restricted area and walk to complete deliveries.

Who would be permitted access during restriction times (exemptions)

Access would be permitted for:

- vehicles registered to an address on the street (including businesses and residents)
- Blue Badge holders needing to access a property on the street
- carers for vulnerable residents needing to access a property on the street
- emergency services vehicles on an emergency call
- utility providers on an emergency call
- Home to School contracted vehicles



Access may be permitted for:

- school staff (dependent on need)
- Hackney Carriages or Private Hires serving a property within the School Street (with proof of booking)
- vehicles being driven by a person working at a business within the School Street

Requests for temporary access will be considered on a case-by-case basis.



If my car is already parked inside the School Street when restrictions begin, can I drive out?

Yes. Vehicles parked within the street before the restriction can leave with care, even during the restricted times.

Would I receive penalty points on my driving licence?

No. School Street enforcement is not linked to driving license penalty points.

Will waste collection still be able to access the School Street?

Council waste collections will be able to access a School Street.
