## Surf Life Saving

Year 7 and 8 students are invited to take part in this year's 'Surf Life Saving' Programme on 28<sup>th</sup> June. The annual programme aims to teach young people basic lifeguarding skills, including first aid and CPR. ## HPV immunisation

The Immunisation Team will be coming in to school after Easter to administer the HPV vaccination to girls at our school. This vaccination helps to protect against cervical cancer. Girls usually have the first dose in Year 8 and the second dose in Year 9.

### Year 8

Year 8 girls have been given information and a form to take home. Please complete the form enclosed in the letter indicating whether or not you give consent for your daughter to be given the HPV vaccination at school. Please return this form by **5<sup>th</sup> April**.

### Year 9

If your daughter had the first dose of the HPV vaccination when they were in Year 8, then they will receive the second dose automatically, there is no need to complete another form. If your daughter did not have the first dose of the vaccine in Year 8, and you would like her to have the first dose in Year 9, please ask your daughter to come to the office to collect the HPV information and consent form.

### Years 10 & 11

If your daughter is due to have the second dose of the vaccination please ask her to come to the office to make sure that she is on our list.

## Year 8 STEM Trip: The Big Bang Fair

The Science department has organised a visit to The Big Bang Fair at the South of England Showground. It provides a unique festival atmosphere with a mix of marquees, agricultural buildings and outdoor space. The students will have a chance to experience over 250 interactive activities and meet individuals to introduce STEM career paths. ### Interested in becoming a doctor?

BrightMed, run by Brighton and Sussex Medical School, identifies and supports young people who have the potential to become tomorrow's doctors. The programme will increase your awareness of what it takes to study medicine and healthcare subjects, through fun, inspiring and interactive teaching focused on medicine, health and science.

We will also give you information, advice and guidance to help you plan your future education, and if you think you might want to become a doctor, we will support you through the application process.

### Is BrightMed for you?

- Have you begun to think about your future career?
- Do you have an interest in science, medicine or healthcare?
- Would you like to know more about a career in medicine?
- Have you ever wondered how doctors become doctors?
- Do you want to know what it's like to be a medical student?

If the answer is YES to any of these questions, why not apply to join the BrightMed programme starting in Year 9!

### What does BrightMed do?

BrightMed works with young people from Year 9 to Year 13. As a 'BrightMedder', you will take part in regular Saturday sessions that involve knowledge sessions, activity days, lectures and seminars. There is also an opportunity for you to experience life as a student with a stay at the University of Sussex campus during a residential summer school at the end of Year 12!

BrightMedders complete a total of 21 sessions over 5 years:

- Years 9 and 10 – 5 days per year
- Year 11 – 4 days
- Year 12 – 4 days (plus 4-day residential)
- Year 13 – Informal support and drop-ins for final application advice and interview practice.
- Participants are also offered support and mentoring throughout the programme via BrightMed's Twitter and Facebook pages.

BrightMed is funded by Brighton and Sussex Medical School, so it won't cost you or your family anything but transport to and from the medical school.
