


Theme of the Week: A Life of Justice-

As a BrightMedder, you will join Brighton and Sussex Medical School students, lecturers and teachers in fun, interactive sessions where you will learn exactly what it is like to be a medical student and what it takes to become a doctor.



BrightMed will show you how competitive becoming a doctor can be. We can arm you with all the right information to make sure you know what to do if you want to become one. We'll encourage and motivate you to keep working hard at school and to get involved with extra-curricular activities.

You'll find out what makes a good medical student and practise some skills to use in your studies at school and when you get to university. You will receive guidance and support on how to make a confident application to study medicine.

Important information for 2022/23:

- Saturday sessions typically run from 10:00-15:00 but may occasionally overrun.
- Food is not provided on Saturday sessions.
- The BrightMed Launch Day will be the 10th September 2022 and the Catch Up Day for Year 10, 11 & 12 on the 17th September 2022*

What do I have to do?

BrightMed looks for students who will commit to the entire programme. Commitment to BrightMed will be demonstrated in a number of ways, including:

- Attendance – you will be expected to attend a majority of activities (most activities will take place on Saturdays and during school holidays)
- Success at school – for example, your GCSE results
- Being an active BrightMed student – taking part in activities, interacting with other participants and BrightMed staff, and completing any tasks that may be set.

Information for Students

Interested in becoming a doctor?

BrightMed, run by Brighton and Sussex Medical School, identifies and supports young people who have the potential to become tomorrow's doctors. The programme will increase your awareness of what it takes to study medicine and healthcare subjects, through fun, inspiring and interactive teaching focused on medicine, health and science.

We will also give you information, advice and guidance to help you plan your future education, and if you think you might want to become a doctor, we will support you through the application process.

Is BrightMed for you?

- Have you begun to think about your future career?
- Do you have an interest in science, medicine or healthcare?
- Would you like to know more about a career in medicine?
- Have you ever wondered how doctors become doctors?
- Do you want to know what it's like to be a medical student?

If the answer is YES to any of these questions, why not apply to join the BrightMed programme starting in Year 9!

What does BrightMed do?

BrightMed works with young people from Year 9 to Year 13. As a 'BrightMedder', you will take part in regular Saturday sessions that involve knowledge sessions, activity days, lectures and seminars. There is also an opportunity for you to experience life as a student with a stay at the University of Sussex campus during a Summer School at the end of Year 12!

BrightMedders complete a total of 22 sessions over 5 years:

- Years 9 and 10 – 5 days per year
- Year 11 – 4 days
- Year 12 – 4 days (plus 4-day Summer School)
- Year 13 – informal support and drop-ins for final application advice and interview practice.
- Participants are also offered support and mentoring throughout the programme.

BrightMed is funded by Brighton and Sussex Medical School, so it won't cost you or your family anything but transport to and from the medical school.
