# Monday 19<sup>th</sup> September- Bank Holiday

Following the announcement of the death of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II, a period of National Mourning has now started and will continue until the end of the State Funeral. The official date of the State Funeral is Monday 19<sup>th</sup> September. This day will be a bank holiday and settings that are normally closed on a bank holiday have been asked to close on this day as a mark of respect. This will include schools and colleges. Therefore, please be aware that King's School will be closed on Monday 19<sup>th</sup> September and pupils will be expected to return at 8.30am on Tuesday 20<sup>th</sup> September.

# Road Safety- IMPORTANT

At the start of the new academic year, we would ask that you have a conversation with your child about road safety. The roads in the surrounding area can get very busy at the start and end of the school day. Please remind your child to cross at the road at the end of the day with the member of staff on duty. When crossing busier roads, they must use a pedestrian crossing. Pupils riding bikes and scooters must travel slowly until they are clear of the pupils leaving both King's and West Blatchington Primary School. We do get a number of emails each year from concerned residents who have had near misses with pupils both on foot and on bikes. We will continue to reinforce these messages in school so we can avoid accidents.

# BeReal – E-Safety Warning for Parents and Pupils

Please be aware that there is a new app called 'BeReal' that some students have on their phones. The app will take a photograph of the person taking the picture as well as those in front of the camera. Please can you discuss this with your child and remind them that people should not have their photograph taken without permission. Photographs of other people should not be distributed around.

### Sets and Streaming

We have had a few queries regarding how students are placed into classes and sets.

Many classes are mixed ability, research has shown that this is often the best way for all students to do as well as possible, although we do have some classes where students are set. We don't do streaming — where students are placed in a higher or lower ability stream for all their subjects, so all tutor groups are mixed ability. In some subjects the classes will be across the year group (6 classes at the same time) and in some they will be split into different sides of the year (so 3 classes at the same time). This is generally to make the timetable work! In all cases classes are kept on review and there is movement where this is in the best interests of the student's education.

#### Maths

In Maths, students are set initially in Year 7 based on SATs results. Groups are reviewed every 6 weeks and there is movement between classes during the year and at the end of the year. Year 8 and 9 sets are then based on end of the year exam results, as well as teacher judgement. Due to sides of the year group, Sets 1 & 4 are highest ability, sets 2 & 5 are middle ability, and sets 3 & 6 are lower ability. Sets are reviewed every 6 weeks, so students have opportunities to move up based on their effort.

This setting continues in Years 10 and 11. Maths has Higher and Foundation tiers of entry for GCSE, and in KS4 the higher sets will be entered for Higher and the lower for Foundation. This is decided based on in-class assessment and mock exams.

#### **English**

In Years 7-9 students are taught in mixed ability groups. In Years 10 and 11 they are broadly grouped into 2 higher, 2 middle and 2 lower sets. There are no tiers of entry in English, so all grades are possible for all students in all classes.

#### Science

In Years 7-9 students are taught in mixed ability groups based on side of the year group (although in Year 9 there is some broad setting). In Year 10 classes 1-4 are

mixed ability and 5 and 6 are for students where more support may be needed. Science does have Higher and Foundation papers as well as having to decide between triple and combined science for students. We are careful not to block students from being able to take any of these exams for as long as possible. By Year 11 we have a good idea who we would like to enter for triple science (usually the top 1 or 2 groups) and who is suitable for Higher and Foundation papers in the other groups. This is monitored through assessment and mock exams and discussed with students as well.

#### PΕ

In PE, students are set through practical ability in Years 7-9. We review these groups each term and make changes if appropriate. Groups are mixed gender and students have access to exactly the same curriculum as their peers. DT classes are the same as PE groups as both have slightly smaller class sizes than other subjects. In these subjects there are no tiers of entry for GCSE and so the exams are not separated into Higher and Foundation.

#### **Humanities, Arts, Computer Science, PSHE**

These are all Mixed ability groups based on their side of the year group. In these subjects there are no tiers of entry for GCSE and so the exams are not separated into Higher and Foundation.

Thank you to all parents and students who attended the Year 11 Information evening on Monday. This was a really useful evening, and I am incredibly grateful to our Heads of the core subjects who attended and presented. It was also good to see the new video for the Sixth Form! Some subjects will be inviting some students to after school interventions from now, some will be waiting until it is more appropriate for their subject. These are based on students who have identified gaps in either their knowledge or exam skills. These are not extra lessons. In general, the thing that will differentiate a student who does well and one who is disappointed in their results is the work and revision they put in at home. We recommend students start revision now (tips on this are in the presentation) and a good thing to focus on now is preparing for the first set of Mock exams in November. Teachers will be able to tell

students what to revise for this paper in addition to the usual work students are being asked to do.

This is a busy and stressful time for Year 11. We will support and guide them as much as possible and want to work as closely with parents as possible. Please do be in touch if you have questions about any of this. The best first point of call is form tutors/head of year for Pastoral questions or concerns, and subject leaders for questions about subjects. There will be some holiday intervention sessions. We will send the details of these out next week. These are also not extra revision sessions but targeted intervention. It is likely the ones in the October Half Term break will be focused on completing NEAs where needed. It is a good idea to be expecting Year 11 students to be working and revising through the holidays from now – obviously factoring some time in for rest and relaxation as well!




# 2021/2022 Get Active Challenge
