Brighton and Sussex Cross Country Races

It was great to see so many of our athletes take part in the two cross country races over the last few weeks at Waterhall. In the Brighton X-C we had over 30 runners across different age groups with lots of year 7's racing for the first time. All students should be commended for running and finishing the tough course in very cold conditions! There were some standout performances: In year 7 Ella (3rd place and getting a bronze medal!), Gabby (6th), Ronnie (8th) and Samuel (13th). In the year 8/9 girls Iris came 3rd and Thea came 15th. In the boys, we had 4 top 20 finishes with Herbie (5th), Elliot (12th), Miller (16th) and Arthur (20th) meaning the year 8/9 boys came 2nd place! In the year 10/11 races Greta and Alex came 5th, Seren in 15th and Sam in 17th.

In the Sussex X-C the standard is significantly higher and each race had close to or over 300 runners in it. Again, students did really well to compete and finish the course the second week in a row with some great results - Greta (22nd), Iris (31st) and Herbie (35th). A huge congratulations to all involved!


Historian of the Fortnight
