


Headteacher's Update

Theme of the week: Healthy Bodies

Dear Parent/Carer,

I hope you are well. We have been struggling in school with a lot of illness, amongst students initially and now amongst staff. Please do pray for us that the students and staff here keep healthy so they are able to come into school and develop in wisdom and maturity.

It is always a busy and slightly stressful time of year in any case as we gear up for exams. Year 10 have had a taste of what is to come this week as they have been sitting their end of year exams (a little bit before the end of the year). They do these in the hall in full exam conditions, and is the first time most have experienced this. I am pleased to say they have taken this extremely seriously and behaved very well. This is a learning experience and failing sometimes is a valuable part of it. All we ever expect is for students to do their best (although sometimes they have to be pushed a bit to work out what their best could be!), I have been proud of the maturity and effort with which they have approached their exams.

This is also the time when year 11s approach their final preparations for their GCSE exams. Some exams have already started, we have had GCSE Art exams this week. Thank you especially to Mrs. O'Sullivan, Mr. McCardie, Mrs. Lancaster and Miss Chambers for the effort they have put in to make these run smoothly.

The exam period can seem daunting, but students should be reassured by two things: that they have put a lot of work in to get to this point that has not been wasted, and that there is still time to revise and prepare even now. As a Christian school we often find it helpful to remember that we believe everyone is made in God's image and inherently valuable, even if sometimes it can feel like the exams only value certain types of gifts. We also find reassurance in the fact that we believe that God has a plan for everyone's life to fulfil their God-given potential. We don't always find this straight away and it can involve struggle, but it is reassuring in the times when it feels like it is all too hard.

Trekking and Trainers—Fantastic achievement!





Year 12 Work


