

Enrichment

On the 29th November we held our first enrichment day of the year. Students from all year groups took part in a range of different activities and experiences.

Half of Year 7 went to Herstmonceux Observatory and Science Centre whilst the other half of the year group were in school to experience a Dicken's themed Christmas theatre performance.

The Year 8s went on a whole year group walk on the downs. This was the first time we have taken a whole year group on to the downs, and the students were excellent. We look forward to making the most of our situation backing onto the South Down's National Park, in the future.

Year 9 had an incredibly important Careers themed day. As well as exploring options for their futures they had the opportunity to meet with and ask questions of a large number of local employers. We hope this will come in useful as they make their GCSE options in the new year.

Year 10 were either in school exploring sustainability or visiting Hampton Court Palace. The students in school used sustainable resources to produce sushi, investigated the safety of sea water collected from the local coast, and planted wild flowers around the school site.

Year 11 had a day looking at revision techniques and exam wellbeing as well as completing some fun activities and having some free time to take part in activities at a more relaxed pace to their usual lessons.

Year 12 and 13 had an incredibly important day learning British Sign Language.

We will be sharing further information regarding the second enrichment day of the year on 29th March.

Sixth Form Highlights: What we've been up to

Fun Fridays Continue in Sixth Form!

The Sixth Form has been buzzing with creativity and engagement as Fun Fridays keep everyone on their toes.

On 29th November, during an enrichment day, we had the pleasure of welcoming Caroline Palmer and her team from Deaf Kidz International, who delivered a captivating British Sign Language (BSL) session. Students participated in an interactive "Sign and Dine" experience, where they learned to order food using sign language.

To build on this, all Sixth Formers are now enrolled in an introductory BSL online course. Upon completion, they will receive a CPD-certified certificate, marking their achievement. As a follow-up, Ms Tamplin will launch a BSL Club in the New Year, open to all year groups. The club will run during Friday lunchtimes and promises to be a fantastic opportunity for everyone to learn more about sign language and the Deaf community. Looking ahead, we are also planning fundraising efforts for Deaf Kidz International during Deaf Awareness Week in May.


Fun Fridays - Psychology in Action

Compassion Charity Update

These achievements are a result of Sixth Form-led initiatives during **Culture Week**, **Culture and Diversity Day**, and **King's Day** at the end of last academic year. Together, our school community has shown that small efforts—like cake sales—can create monumental change for those in need.
