Dear Parents/Carers,

We seem to be in the height of cold/flu season! Anecdotally I know a lot of families are suffering with illness and we are certainly seeing our attendance figures take a hit. We of course understand that students get ill and when they are too unwell to come to school they must rest and recover. However, we would encourage students into school with more minor colds. The links between attendance and attainment, and between attendance and students' holistic wellbeing are so clear and well-proven that attendance is always a top priority for pastoral staff at King's. A reminder that the school's attendance target is 96%. Any student with an attendance figure of 90% or below is missing a day of school or more every fortnight which will have a significant impact on their progress, attainment and wellbeing. For Year 11 students every day now really is vital if they are to reach their full potential in external exams this summer.

If you haven't already secured your tickets to this year's whole school production of Oliver! I would encourage you to get booked in. I have been fortunate enough to witness some of the rehearsals and the show is looking, and sounding, fantastic already. I hope you will be able to join us on the 11th, 12th,or 13th February to enjoy the hard work and talent of our students.

Squad: Anoushka (captain), Iris, Orlanda, Neve, Imogen, Maddie, Bluebell, Darcy, Erin and Izzy.






OLIVER!

PROPS for OLIVER!



Other items we would appreciate borrowing: opera glasses, old sacks or blankets, candlesticks .




King's Sixth Form


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
