

#### Theme of the Week

#### **HPV vaccination (Hunan Papilloma Virus)**

**Yr8:** The Immunisation Team will be coming into school on **Wednesday 9<sup>th</sup> July** to administer the HPV vaccination to students in Year 8. Parents and carers of Year 8 students will have received an email regarding this, together with information from the Immunisation Service with details of how give consent for this vaccination.

Yrs 9, 10 & 11: Most students will have received this vaccination in Yr8. However, If your child is in Year 9, 10 or 11 and they have not had this vaccination and you would like them to have it in school, please contact the office via <a href="mailto:admin@kingsschoolhove.org.uk">admin@kingsschoolhove.org.uk</a> as soon as possible so that the consent form can be sent to you. Please note that we do not hold information regarding previous immunisations. If you are not sure whether your child has had this vaccination, you will need to contact the Immunisation Team on: 01273 696011 x3789

Please note that vaccinations will not be given without parental consent.

#### Hot Weather

This week the weather has been particularly inclement but we hope there will be some warmer weather before the end of term!

A reminder that students are no longer required to wear blazers on the school site (if the weather is cooler of course they are welcome to continue to wear them and school jumpers as they wish). All students are permitted to wear charcoal grey, tailored shorts, in the summer term.

Students are strongly encouraged to bring a refillable water bottle to school. They are able to fill these up before school, at break time, at lunch time, after school. This means that students never have to go longer than 1 hour and 40 minutes before they can refill their bottle. Students are never permitted out of lessons to refill bottles. This ensures that no learning time is lost and disruption around the school site is minimised.



#### Use of the MUGA/Field

Year 7 students are now permitted to use the MUGA at break and lunch times.

In return, all students are now permitted to use the courtyard area. This change helps to transition Year 7 students to full time use of the MUGA at break and lunch times as they enter Year 8 in September.

The library (or an alternative space during exams) continues to be available at break and lunch times, as does the main hall and SEND room for those with passes. The grassed area to the south of the MUGA is available for students at break and lunch times. Use of the MUGA is managed so that there is fair access for all students who wish to play ball games during social times.



#### **Summer Enrichment**

The summer term is always a great time of year in school, with lots of exciting events taking place. On 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> July our final two enrichment days of the year will be taking place. There is a huge range of visits and events going on and you should receive further information, if you have not already, about your child's year group.

**Year 7** will be taking part in the annual camp at Blackland Farm activity centre. This is our biggest camp yet and the year 7 team are really excited to be going away. There will be a small number of year 7s in school and we will be planning fun activities so that they have an exciting couple of days.

**Year 8** will be completing theme park and rollercoaster themed days. They will design, plan, and build rollercoasters in school before heading to Thorpe Park to see the real deal. This is always a popular event, and I am sure the Year 8s will make some of the most creative designs seen to date.

Year 9 have a day learning about healthy living which includes discussion on good mental health, science experiments and fitness and games challenges run by the PE department. On the second day we will be running our end of key stage 3 away day. Students will have the opportunity to reflect on their time during key stage 3 and to set targets for the upcoming GCSEs. In addition, they will develop bonds and team working skills as they visit Blackland Farm activity centre. Students in school will complete their own team challenges which will mirror the day running out of school. In addition, Year 9 and 10 students are off to Lille with the languages department where they will have an unforgettable experience discovering French culture.

**Year 10** in addition to those going on the trip to France, will spend the first day on a Faith based walk in Hove. In addition to visiting a range of places of worship, they will have a year group picnic; a perfect opportunity to relax at the end of a year of hard work. On the second day the students will be taking part in a range of options: a London History theatre trip, a Brighton coastal walk including a pier visit and volleyball at Yellow Wave, or a South Downs walk.

Year 12 will be completing their work experience this week.


#### **West End Success**

#### **BrightMed 2025: Applications Now Open**

BrightMed is the Brighton and Sussex Medical School's Widening Participation programme which identifies and supports young people across Sussex who have the potential to become tomorrow's doctors.

As a BrightMedder, students will take part in regular Saturday sessions on the University of Sussex campus. This will involve lectures, seminars, knowledge sessions and activities. Sixth form students who are part of BrightMed may also be eligible for the Guaranteed Interview Scheme (GIS).

The programme works with students from Year 9 to Year 12 who live or study in Sussex, and who meet our widening participation eligibility criteria. If you are currently in Year 8 to Year 11, we want to receive your application for BrightMed 2025/26!


#### **Brighton and Sussex Medical School Admissions Talks: Summer Series**

#### Med-Chi Lecture - Low and High Tech Eye Surgery

The Brighton & Sussex Medico-Chirurgical Society present their June lecture from Professor Saul Rajak.

Saul is a consultant ophthalmologist specialising in oculoplastic and orbital disease at the Sussex Eye Hospital, University Hospitals Sussex NHS Foundation Trust. He is an honorary professor at Brighton and Sussex Medical School. Saul leads research in a wide range of areas including orbital imaging, thyroid eye disease and orbital anatomy. Saul spent three years in Ethiopia, running trials into the surgical management of trachomatous trichiasis and was awarded his PhD for this research. Back in Brighton, he has developed and led one of the leading oculoplastic units in the country and has a particular interest in endoscopic lacrimal and orbital surgery. Saul set up and runs the surgical video teaching website and runs the annual Brighton Endoscopic Lacrimal and Orbital training course.
