Summer Showcase


Last Thursday we were treated to one of the most memorable events in our school's history the 2025 Summer Showcase.

MFL—Year 8 and 9

In Years 8 and 9 students have the opportunity to further develop their skills in either French or Spanish and parents are now invited to express a preference. This could be for a variety of reasons such as being more passionate for one of the languages offered, family links to a specific country, progress or finding the fluidity between two languages easier, to name a few.

Whilst we cannot guarantee first choice, we will do our best to match your child with their preference. In some cases, a conversation between your child and yourself may facilitate the decision. The total time allocated to MFL remains at three periods per week so in Years 8 and 9, students get three lessons a week in one language.

Students who are already bilingual in one of our taught languages due to speaking French or Spanish at home generally get placed into the 'other' language and can be entered for a GCSE in their home language (French/Spanish) in Year 10 or 11. Where possible, we have also facilitated GCSE exams in other home languages (e.g. Arabic, Italian, Persian, German, Chinese, Russian, Turkish) in Years 10 and 11. Parents are asked to get in touch with our exams officer about this (i.lancaster@kingsschoolhove.org.uk) so the potential exam and year of exam entry can be recorded. We will take into account parents' preferences and views on this so I invite you to please complete the Microsoft Form by following the link below by 8.30am next Wednesday 9th July, indicating your preference and any reasons as to why your child should follow a specific language path. Responses need to be in by that time so that as a department we can set class groups; children will get their timetables in September at the start of the school year. Until class groups are confirmed I am unable to say which teacher(s) will have which group.
