Harry's Mum has let us know that "Thanks to your support and kindness Harry is making real progress with his rehabilitation. We now have the FES bike at home which Harry uses almost daily. We have been able to make key adaptations to the house so he can move around more independently and now have a vehicle to get him to his appointments. Thanks to your generous donations we have been able to increase Harry's physio and now have access to a weekly hydro pool session which is so important for his recovery.

We still have a long road ahead and will hopefully be able to purchase a new power chair for him soon. We couldn't have done this alone and will be forever grateful to Harry's, ever growing, Village".

A Level Drama and Theatre Studies



Some of you will now be making decisions about which A levels to study next year. Did you know you do NOT have to have studied Drama at GCSE to take it at A level? You just need to show a willingness to work creatively with others.

Students learn about performing in a variety of theatrical styles and how their own work can reflect important practitioners of the 20th and 21st centuries.

The lessons will be fun and explorative, focusing on both scripts and devised pieces. You will be expected to come to the theatre (what a hardship!) to experience live performances.

My ex-students work in a wide variety of roles as: a West End musical theatre performer, who starred in 'Moulin Rouge' and 'Heathers'; a stand up comedian who has worked with Ricky Gervais and appeared on Late Night at the Apollo; a comedian and producer who curated part of the Brighton Fringe Festival and won a 5* review from The Telegraph at the Edinburgh Festival; teachers (History, Drama, English, Primary); nurses; a photographer; a food stylist and cookery writer working for The Guardian, BBC food and Ocado magazine; a BBC 3 Comedy writer and producer and a sound designer for the National Theatre.

This shows how the skills gained from this A level can eventually lead you into a creative job or a different kind of professional role. These skills are valued by employers, who recognise the team aspect, and how students are learning to express themselves and their ideas in a creative and meaningful way.

81% understand more about further study and careers


