

6th Form closure in 2027

Our 6th form will close it's doors in the summer of 2027.

We remain committed to ensuring an excellent education and experience of Key Stage 5 for our current Sixth Formers.

Parent Governor Election—Nominations by Friday 7th November (today!)

We are now seeking a Parent Governor to join the local Governing Body at King's with effect from 1st January 2026. This is an exciting opportunity for someone who wants to bring fresh and stimulating ideas to the school and to support our Christian ethos. Two Parent Governors are elected as directed by the Articles of the Russell Education Trust, of which King's School is a part. Nominations for Parent Governor vacancies are made by parents of students registered at the school. Should there be more nominations than vacancies, a secret ballot will be held. Parents of registered students attending the school may offer themselves for election. Parent Governors can serve for a term of up to four years (irrespective of how long their child remains as a registered student at the school) and can stand for re-election if their child remains as a registered student of the school. Jazz Juniors - A new musical ensemble starting Monday 10th November

Next week is <u>Inter Faith Week</u>, a week that celebrates the UK's religious diversity and strengthens ties between communities that follow different faiths.

There are a range of films and resources about the different religions within the UK on TrueTube. In particular, the film <u>Climate Change: Multi-Faith Views</u>, in which different viewpoints on the climate crisis are explored, and we hear about how various faith communities are coming together and focusing on what binds them together to help combat some of the problems the world is facing.

Year 11 Mock Exams—Thursday 13th November to Friday 21st November

The first set of year 11 mock examinations will start next Thursday and run for 6 days until Friday 21st November. All year 11 students have received their timetables and should (hopefully!) have been revising hard.

Students can get anxious about these exams. It is important for them to see them as a learning experience and to remember that sometimes failing gives more useful information than doing well. If you are concerned about any anxiety relating to these exams please do contact their form tutor or Head of Year.

One of the purposes of these exams is to get students used to being in exam rooms under exam conditions. It is important they get used to the routines that will help them be successful in their actual GCSE exams. One of these routines is making sure they have the correct equipment for each exam. Different exams have different requirements and we don't have enough equipment to lend if many students do not bring the correct equipment. It is particularly important to check when a calculator is required (maths, science, business definitely) and when equipment such as compasses are needed. The best idea is to make sure each student has all of their equipment in their bag and brings it all everyday!

Final things to be aware of

- You can find a link to the exam timetable on the website under Exams <u>King's School</u>.
- There will be one or two occasions when exams go through break time. We do make every effort to ensure the canteen remains open for students in these cases. It may be sensible for students to bring their own snacks in case what they normally eat is unavailable.
- Some exams will finish after 3pm. This is marked on the exam timetable as well.
- Students are expected into school at the normal time in normal school uniform. They will register on the MUGA and be brought into their exams for both morning and afternoon exams. Students will normally be in their normal lessons between the morning and afternoon exams. We recommend that every student brings in some revision they can do independently if there is the option in a lesson.
