Friday 5th December—Enrichment Day

Year 7 students will either be going to the Science museum in London or will be in School watching the Globe Players Theatre group and taking part in a series of Dicken's themed Christmas activities.

Year 8 students have had the choice of going to the Tate Modern in London and exploring the Leake Street graffiti tunnels, or they will be meeting in school to walk on the South Downs with the Geography department to explore the national park on our doorstep.

Year 9 students are in school to take part in a careers themed day ahead of the GCSE options process. In addition to a number of careers activities running in the morning, they will take part in a careers fair where they will be able to meet with a number of local employers.

Year 10 students are either going to Hampton Court to explore the Tudor element of the History GCSE in more detail, or they will be in school completing a series of practical activities looking at sustainability.

Year 11 are in school for the day. In the morning they will have their year group photo before taking part in activities ranging from preparing for their year book and prom, improving exam preparation and technique, and the importance of being active and creative to support wellbeing.

Clothing should be appropriate for the weather, and for school. No open-toed shoes, cropped tops, offensive images or text. Students who are inappropriately dressed will be sent home to change. We do understand that some students find non-uniform days stressful and for this reason we strictly limit the number of non-uniform days to two per year; one in December for Christmas, and King's Day in the summer.

They will have several lessons, a tutor time, and an extended break time, during which there will be a brunch service in the canteen. The day will end with celebration assemblies. Visit by a West End performer—Stranger Things: the first shadow

On Monday 24th November Miranda Mufema came in to talk about her experience playing Patty Newby in the West End show, Stranger Things - the first shadow. As an ex student of King's it was wonderfully inspiring to hear about her formative years growing up and working with Thirdspace Theatre, the NYT and performing in many local venues before being cast in the West End by legendary director Stephen Daldry (Billy Elliot, An Inspector Calls). She also gave practical suggestions about how students could develop their skills and creative abilities, such as joining a drama club at school or locally, doing creative writing and trying to see as much theatre as possible. Laser Pens

We have recently had two cases of students bringing powerful laser pens to school. Laser beams are highly concentrated light and If directed into the eye, even for a fraction of a second, they can cause retinal burns or permanent vision loss. Laser pens have always been included on the list of banned items and so students should never bring them into school.



Hair Colouring

As fashions evolve we often need to remind our students of the rules around hair, make-up, jewellery and <u>uniform expectations</u>. The rules relating to hair have remained unchanged for many years and are as follows: No hairstyles less than grade 2 in length and no shapes cut into the hair e.g. stripes, 'tramlines'. No brightly coloured or two-tone hair. Long hair must be tied back when requested by teachers as a safety precaution. Typically this will include certain lessons in PE, science and technology, otherwise the

In our <u>banned items</u> list it states that students are not permitted 'dyed hair other than natural colours'.

Please ensure that your child adheres to these rules. If they arrive at school with brightly coloured or two-tone hair colour it is likely they will be placed in isolation for the school day and asked to rectify the colouring before the next school day.
