Assemblies this week

Mrs Price and Mr Chamberlain ran assemblies for all students in Years 8-11 this week on the themes of misogyny and consent (Year 7 will have their assembly on Monday next week). The assemblies were adapted to ensure they were age appropriate for all year groups. They covered an explanation of what we mean by consent, and why this is so important in healthy relationships. For older students they also covered an explanation of what is meant by the term 'misogyny' and an explanation of where students might encounter misogyny online and in society today. As a school we are very clear with students that misogyny, sexism, and all forms of sexual harassment (including online harassment) are not tolerated at King's. 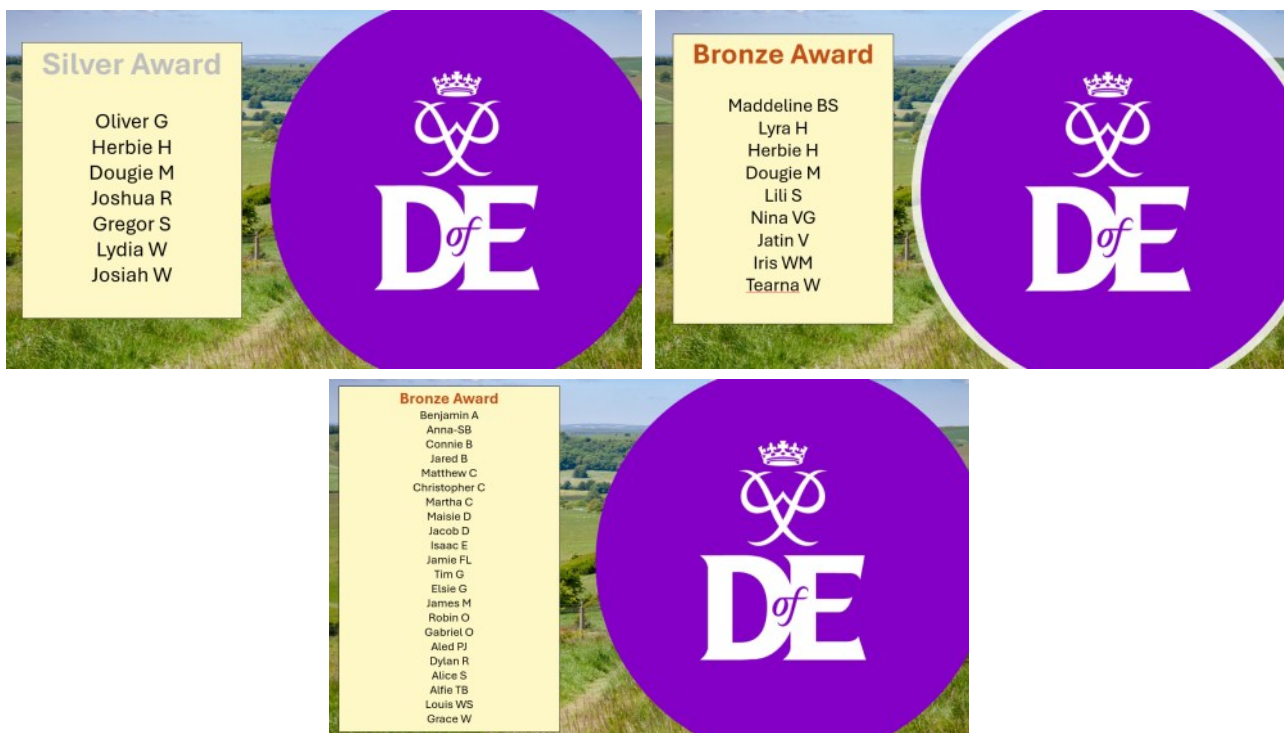
Duke of Edinburgh Congratulations!

Film Music Workshop Inspires Our Music Students

This week, as part of a collaborative education project with Create Music and the Brighton Philharmonic Orchestra, a group of our GCSE and Sixth Form Music students attended an inspiring film music workshop led by renowned composer and film music expert Neil Brand.

During the session, Neil introduced students to the process of composing for film, exploring how sound is created and used to enhance visual storytelling. He demonstrated this by improvising live piano accompaniments to silent films, incorporating suggestions and musical ideas offered by the students themselves. Seeing these ideas transformed instantly into a film score was a fascinating and memorable experience for everyone involved.

Neil also spoke openly about careers and pathways into the music industry, sharing how he has built a successful career without following a traditional route. This proved especially encouraging for students considering a future in music or the creative industries.

Following the workshop, students have been offered complimentary tickets to attend a concert on Saturday 24th, where they will hear the Brighton Philharmonic Orchestra perform a selection of film music, including works discussed during the workshop.

Careers Diversity in Trades event

This week King's School was delighted to host a Careers Diversity in Trades event for our Year 10 and Year 11 students, delivered in partnership with Brighton & Hove City Council (BHCC). The event brought together an inspiring range of apprentices, to shine a light on the many high-quality career pathways available within the trades sector.

The purpose of the morning was simple: to broaden students' horizons and challenge outdated stereotypes about who can—or should—pursue a trade. From carpentry to plumbing and electrical engineering, students had the opportunity to explore diverse roles that combine practical skill, innovation, and long-term career stability.
