## Year 9 Battlefields Trip to the Somme and Ypres: A Powerful Journey Through History

Last week our Year 9 students embarked on an unforgettable two-day visit to the battlefields of Ypres and the Somme, an immersive opportunity to deepen their understanding of the First World War. Travelling via the Eurotunnel, spirits were high from the moment we set off, and students demonstrated impeccable behaviour throughout. Their engagement with staff, guides, and the historical sites themselves was outstanding, making the trip both educational and deeply meaningful.



### **Exploring the Ypres Salient.**

Our journey began in Poperinge, where we visited the Deserters' Firing Post. Here, students reflected on the harrowing reality of wartime discipline and the emotional strain endured by soldiers on the front line.

**We then travelled to Langemark German Cemetery**, where Mr Chamberlain led an insightful discussion on the striking differences between German and Allied headstones. Students explored how symbolism, design, and commemoration vary across nations. We also examined the significance of Adolf Hitler's wartime visit to the cemetery during the height of Nazi control, and what this revealed about the politics of memory.

**At Tyne Cot Cemetery**, the largest Commonwealth cemetery in the world, students learned about the global nature of the conflict. They were challenged to find as many

Commonwealth headstones as possible, an activity that highlighted the truly international scale of the war effort.

**Our next stop was Essex Farm**, the site closely associated with John McCrae's famous poem "*In Flanders Fields*." Here, students explored the medical dressing station and discussed the immense developments in battlefield medicine. They also learned the moving story of Joe Strudwick, a 15-year-old soldier who had lied about his age to reach the front line.

**At Hooge Crater Museum**, students enjoyed a brilliant guided tour from the owner, Nik, who brought the history of the Western Front to life with engaging stories and detailed artefacts.

**We continued to the Passchendaele Museum**, where students experienced the recreated trench system. Walking through the narrow dugouts and muddy walkways offered a powerful, sensory understanding of trench conditions, one of the most memorable moments of the entire trip.

After an evening meal at a local Belgian restaurant, **we attended the Menin Gate Last Post Ceremony**, where students represented the school with honour by laying a wreath in remembrance of the fallen. It was a moving and dignified conclusion to our day in Ypres.

### **The Somme.**

Reflecting on Sacrifice on day two, we travelled south to the Somme region.

**Our first key stop was the Accrington Pals memorial**, where we discussed the heartbreaking story of Pals Battalions, groups of friends, neighbours, and co-workers who enlisted together. Students explored the motivations behind this movement and the devastating consequences it had for working-class communities across Britain.

**We then visited Beaumont-Hamel Newfoundland Memorial Park**, one of the best-preserved battlefields of the First World War. Walking through the original trench lines allowed students to visualise troop positions and the scale of the battlefield. Mr Chamberlain guided us through the harrowing events of 1 July 1916, explaining how the Newfoundland Regiment suffered catastrophic losses within minutes of going "over the top."

**Our final stop was the Thiepval Interpretation Centre and Memorial**, where the names of over 72,000 missing soldiers are inscribed on the walls. Here, Mr Chamberlain explained why wartime death notices often conveyed messages of "instant death" and "no suffering," helping students understand how families were comforted during a time of immense grief. In a poignant conclusion to our trip, we located the name of Mr Chamberlain's own great-grandfather and reflected on the lasting impact and legacy of the war. As a school, we gathered for a prayer and a two-minute silence in his memory and in honour of all who served.

The trip was blessed with glorious weather, wonderful attitudes, and a genuine sense of unity. Students behaved impeccably, asked thoughtful questions, and represented the school with maturity and respect. Alongside meaningful historical learning, they also had great fun—strengthening friendships, sharing new experiences, and gaining perspectives that classroom lessons alone simply cannot provide.

We are incredibly proud of our Year 9 cohort for the way they conducted themselves and fully embraced this opportunity. It was an enriching and moving journey, one that we hope they will carry with them for many years to come.





## Last Friday's Enrichment Day

Last Friday was the second enrichment day of the year. Students had a fantastic day taking part in a wide range of activities and trips.

Year 7 swapped activities from last time with students switching places to take part in the Science Museum trip to London and the in school Globe Players Theatre day.

Year 8 learnt about the First World War with a live speaker from the Living History team and the opportunity to use their creativity to make trenches.

Year 9 took part in the History trip to Ypres (see the separate report). There was also a group visiting the rewilding site at Knepp who found out about the work being carried out and the wildlife that is thriving on the site. Students in school walked to Benfield Valley to look at the importance of protecting the areas around us as well as across Sussex.

Year 10 took part in a culture day in school. They learnt about the work of Compassion UK and about the experiences of students and staff from cultures around the world. In the afternoon these students completed a series of games and sports from around the world.

Year 11 completed vital coursework with their GCSE deadlines looming. The year group worked hard and made the most of the opportunity to improve their grades and to complete important work.

Our final enrichment days of the year will be on Monday 6th July and Tuesday 7th July. Watch this space...

On Friday 13th March, a group of King's students took part in a collaborative music project with Brighton Festival Youth Choir (BFYC), bringing together schools from across Brighton & Hove to create original songs on the theme of climate change. The event culminated in a performance at the Attenborough Centre for the Creative Arts, University of Sussex.

Since September, a dedicated group of Key Stage 3 students worked hard to compose King's entry, later rehearsing it with the King's Choir in preparation for the performance. On the day, students took part in a range of music and drama workshops before taking to the stage. They delivered a confident and emotive performance alongside a range of impressive contributions from other schools. The day was filmed, and as soon as the performance footage is made available, it will be shared with the students.

Although King's did not take the top prize, the experience was hugely rewarding, and I am very proud of our students and how they represented King's. Well done to all!

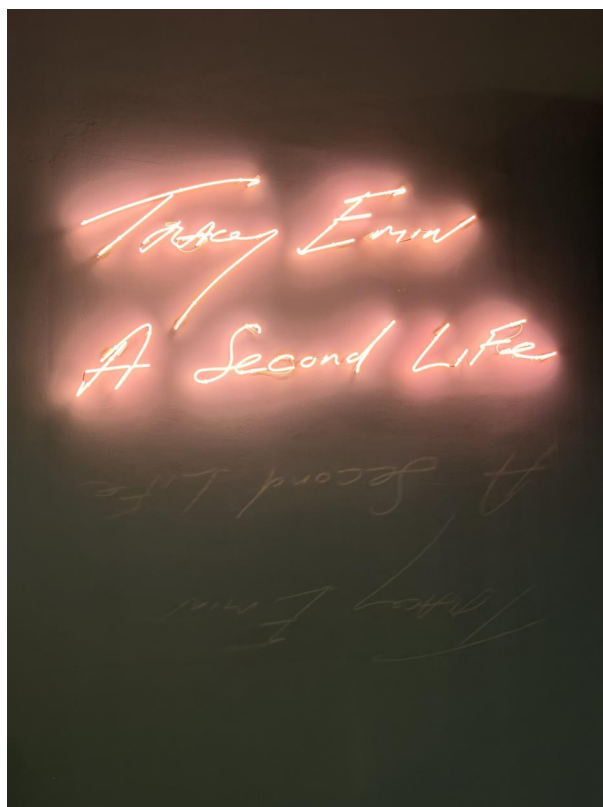
## Sixth Form RE Day: Exploring Sacred Spaces

Our Sixth Form students enjoyed a thought-provoking RE Day in London on Friday exploring how both traditional and modern spaces can express the sacred.

In the morning, the group visited the **Tate Modern**, including **Tracey Emin's *Second Life*** exhibition. Emin's powerful and personal works encouraged students to consider how themes such as vulnerability, identity, and meaning can also create a sense of the sacred beyond conventional religious settings.

We crossed the bridge and headed to **St Paul's Cathedral**, where students experienced the grandeur and symbolism of one of the country's most important religious sites. They reflected on how architecture, art, and atmosphere shape worship and spiritual experience.

The day offered a rich contrast between historic and contemporary expressions of spirituality, sparking thoughtful discussion and inspiring new perspectives.

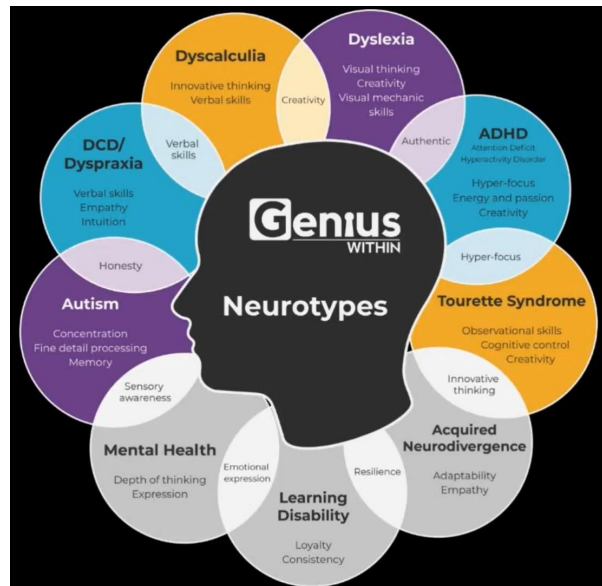




## Neurodiversity Celebration Week at King's School



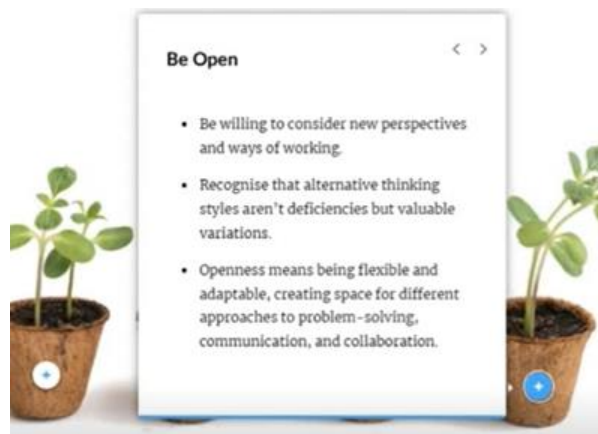
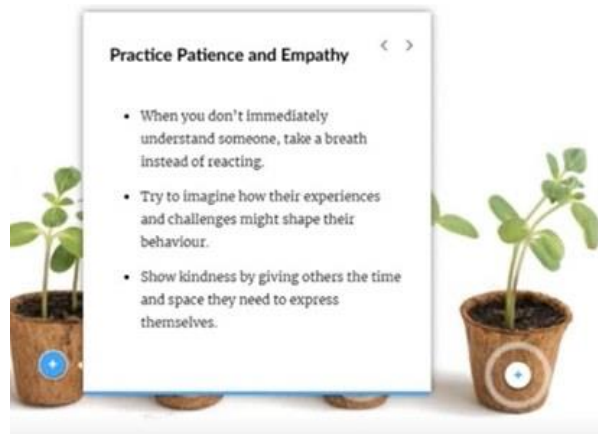
Last week, King’s School proudly celebrated Neurodiversity Celebration Week, a time dedicated to recognising and valuing the many unique ways our students think, learn, and experience the world. Throughout the week, students explored what neurodiversity means, learned about different neurotypes such as autism, ADHD and dyslexia, and reflected on how these differences bring incredible strengths to our school community.



As part of the celebrations, students watched a video created by autistic students from a school in London, who interviewed their staff about lived experiences, the importance of embracing differences, and their personal “superpowers”. This helped our young people understand how empowering and affirming it can be when others share their own stories.

Across all year groups, King’s students took part in activities encouraging them to identify their unique abilities, strategies that help them succeed, and ways to build resilience. They discussed how different thinking styles contribute to creativity, problem-solving and empathy, and how making small adjustments can ensure everyone feels included and celebrated.

At King’s, we are committed to nurturing an inclusive mindset, promoting curiosity, patience and openness, and ensuring every young person feels a strong sense of belonging. Neurodiversity Celebration Week was a wonderful reminder that no two brains are the same, and that is one of our greatest strengths.



## Year 8 Frontline Living History Trench Day

Year 8 took part in an immersive enrichment day focused on life on the front line during the First World War. The day began with a workshop delivered by *Frontline Living History*, which explored the global nature of the conflict, recruitment, soldiers' uniforms and equipment, daily life in and out of the trenches, weaponry, gas warfare, and more.

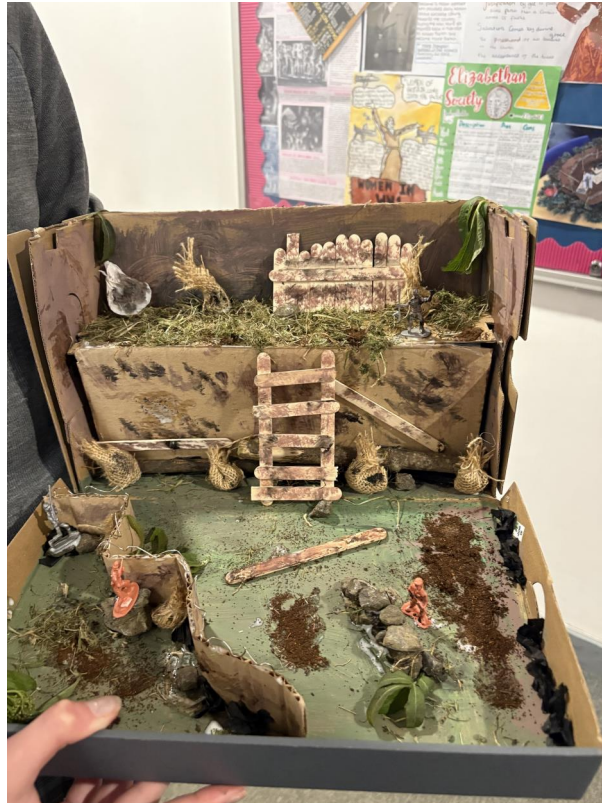
Students had the opportunity to handle real and replica artefacts and to try on items such as helmets and hand grenades, helping bring the period vividly to life.

Following the workshop, students created their own trench shoebox dioramas. They approached this task with real enthusiasm and creativity, producing some excellent pieces of work, many of which have been kept for display.

To conclude the day, we watched *Private Peaceful* to consolidate their visual understanding of trench warfare and deepen their empathy for soldiers' experiences.

It was an excellent day overall, and Year 8s behaviour, engagement, and attitude throughout all activities were exemplary.





## Reach for the Stars - STEM Day

Last week, 14 Year 7 and 8 students visited Hove Park School for a STEM event for girls called 'Reach for the Stars'. They took part in exciting workshops about X-rays, helicopter flight, solar energy and the science of pain. They also listened to a fascinating talk by Dr Elinor's D'Elia, a materials scientist from Imperial College that featured a gecko! Our students had a fantastic day and learnt a lot about the world of STEM.



## Year 9 Trip to Hamilton

Fifty Year 9 students had the fantastic opportunity to attend a performance of *Hamilton* this week, and the trip was a resounding success. From start to finish, our students were a credit to the school, their behaviour in the theatre was exemplary, and several members of the public commented on how respectful and engaged they were throughout the performance.

### **About the Show**

*Hamilton* tells the story of Alexander Hamilton, one of the Founding Fathers of the United States, charting his rise from an orphaned immigrant to a key figure in shaping a nation. Told through a groundbreaking blend of hip-hop, R&B, and musical theatre, the show explores themes of ambition, legacy, revolution, and the personal rivalries that shaped early American politics.

The performance was outstanding. Students were captivated by the music, storytelling, and choreography, and many commented on how powerful and exciting they found the production. It was wonderful to see them so enthusiastic and immersed in the experience.

Overall, it was a brilliant evening out and great way to mark the end of term. Both staff and students had a great time, and we look forward to offering more enriching cultural opportunities in the future.

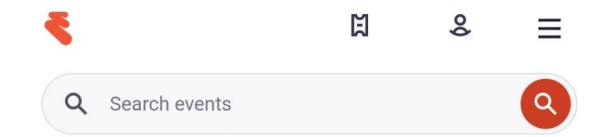
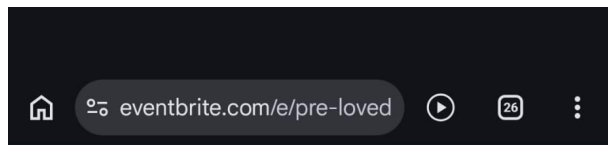
